Wildlife Defenders

OCTOBER 16 at 6:00 pm

The Wildlife Defenders are returning with a new unique line-up of animals. The show's theme, "How do animals protect themselves?" will feature African-crested porcupine, swift fox, stick bus, toucan, cusimanse, monkey-tailed lizard, and an armadillo. Audiences will learn how these animals manage to survive in the wild and how young patrons can protect themselves as well. This program is made possible through the NY State Family Literacy grant.

Hand Needle Felting

October 22 at 6:00 pm

Needle felting is the process of felting/tangling one piece of wool to another using barbed needles. The needles take the wool fibers from one piece and drag them through the other piece where they tangle and attach the two pieces. There are two types of needle felting: Applique felting: attaching wool yarn, to a flat piece of wool fabric or felt. Sculptural felting: creating a three dimensional piece of felt from wool.
